

Title: Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Cookies

Servings: 6-7 Cookies

Time to Cook: 30min

Ingredients:

- 1 cup chocolate chips
- 1 egg yolk
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 10 tbls unsalted butter
- 1/3 cup pumpkin puree
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1 1/2 cups flour
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1/8 tsp baking powder
- 1 1/2 tsp cinnamon

Instructions:

- 1. Brown the Butter in a small pot
- 2. Once browned, place butter aside
- 3. In one bowl combine all wet ingredients
- 4. In a separate bowl, combine all dry ingredients
- 5. Add the butter to the dry ingredients and stir
- 6. Then combine the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients and stir
- 7. Line your baking sheet with parchment paper or foil
- 8. Either use your hands or a spoon and shape dough into a small ball and place about 3/4 cookies on the sheet
- 9. Preheat oven to 375 and bake for 10min
- 10. Cool down and enjoy!
