



WHAT IS STAFF COUNCIL?

We are a campus organization run by staff for staff. We advocate on behalf of staff on issues relating to campus culture and morale, work to improve campus communication, and participate in shared campus decision-making.

STAFF COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP

Representation on Staff Council is by division and our members are elected by their peers to represent their divisions' interests and needs. There are currently 13 representative seats and 5 officer seats. We also welcome volunteers!

We plan and sponsor events, provide networking and leadership opportunities, represent staff on campus committees, celebrate staff awards and recognitions, and organize community service projects, all for or on behalf of staff at CSU Channel Islands.
