



Working with People Who Can't Get Along

- Note changes of behavior in a neutral way e.g., voice tone, body language, level of engagement
- Introduce empathy "from the balcony" Validate perspective, explore status quo effect
- Explore conditions for "boundaries discussion" 3rd-party-help? "Ground agreements"? Apology?

Topic:

Working with People Who Can't Get Along

Concept:

Being in the middle of someone else's fighting... or just enduring hostility between coworkers... can be draining and miserable. Here are three tips on how to help others trapped in conflict, and take care of yourself in the process:

Ask about changes you've observed in your coworker vs about the conflict itself

It may be tempting to talk directly about an obvious conflict between coworkers, but that can be perceived as taking sides or not being supportive. It's better to focus upon what you've observed and your interest in their happiness, productivity and engagement in work. Asking a coworker if they would like to talk about their perspective on what you have observed invites a conversation vs appearing to determine fault and blame. For example, you can ask about a change in voice tone at a meeting, a change in facial expressions, or a change in engagement in certain aspects of their work.

• Express empathy from a neutral perspective

When people feel hurt and anger in any kind of relationship — even in a work relationship — they usually need to have their feelings validated before they can move forward. However, validation can be seen as taking sides if it sounds like agreement. To avoid appearing to tell someone they are right or wrong about the situation, ask questions from the perspective of a third party interested in seeing your unit succeed. Try questions such as: "What worries you?" "How do you see this playing out?" or "How do you experience it when they do that?" Then, frame things in terms of how their feelings make sense in light of what they have shared (vs. "the truth").

• Explore a boundaries and "ground agreements" discussion

Although coworkers in conflict ideally would find a way to reconcile, making it happen without help is often a bridge too far, especially when emotions are high. Similarly, telling people to "work it out" usually just papers over problems... at best. Although it sounds counterintuitive, it can be more effective to invite a conversation about what might be helpful in working together with ongoing disagreement. Ask what each person can do today to allow the immediate work at hand to happen, such as agreeing how to coordinate/communicate, offering an apology for a specific, discrete thing, or agreeing to a facilitated with a third party neutral such as the ombuds office.
