State-level Budget

The Good News

- California economy now 5th largest in the world. An unprecedented period of economic growth.
- Record low unemployment.
- State anticipating significant budget surplus current estimate at \$21B. Governor's focus continue **building reserves**, and paying down state debts and unfunded liabilities.

The Cautions

Economic condition can change quickly. Concerns about an approaching **recession** are rising. Volatility and risks attributed to federal level policy decisions, aging population, and ongoing housing shortage.

Governor's Proposed Budget

\$300 million increase in *ongoing* state funds

"The single largest proposed investment by any governor in the history of the CSU."

Focus on increasing access, preserving affordability, and improving student success and timely degree completion.

Governor's Proposed Budget

\$264 million increase in *one-time* funds

Category	In Millions
Deferred maintenance backlog/child care facilities expansion	247
Basic Needs partnerships (*hunger/housing needs)	15
Feasibility Study/San Joaquin Valley	2
Total	264

Additional funding: \$250,000 to support Project Rebound (to assist previously incarcerated prospective students)



CSU Budget Request

\$554.3 million increase in *ongoing* funds

Expenditures	In Millions
Graduate Initiative 2025	75.0
Employee Salaries	147.8
Academic Facilities/Infrastructure	80.08
Mandatory Costs Increases (*Health benefits, retirement, maintenance of new facilities, and minimum wage increases.)	45.4
5% Increase in Enrollment (*Would add 18,207 Full-Time Equivalent Students)	206.1
Total	554.3

	Tuition from Enrollment Growth	98.3
	Board of Trustees Additional Request	456.0

Governor's proposed budget assumes no tuition increase.

Increase in Resident Enrollment	206.1	62.0
Facilities & Infrastructure	80.08	0
Total (Ongoing)	\$554.3	\$300.0

CSU Request vs. Governor's Budget: One-time Funds

Investment Area	CSU Request	Governor's January Proposal
Deferred Maintenance	250.0	247.0
Basic Needs Partnerships	15.0	15.0
Feasibility Study/San Joaquin Valley		2.0
Total (One-time)	\$265.0	\$264.0
Total Combined (Ongoing and One-time)	\$819.3	\$564.0

CSUCI 2019/20 Planning Assumptions

- Funded enrollment growth; likely greater than the 2% increase projected
- No tuition increase
- Compensation Adjust through FY 2021/22 as reflected in collective bargaining agreements
- Redirects

CSUCI Budget Principles

- Achieve a **balanced and sustainable** annual budget.
- **Reallocate** and prioritize resources to support strategic initiatives.
- Emphasize a **long-term** planning perspective.
- Enhance revenue generation (new revenue streams, strategic use of fees, etc.).
- Remain <u>flexible</u> in an effort to preserve momentum toward strategic initiatives.

Budget Timeline Key Dates

April 26	Budget Units	Hyperion opens for data entry
May 3	Budget Town Hall	Division presentations/budget requests; general campus budget update
May 10	Governor's May Revise	Tentative release date only
June 15	CA Budget Act	State Legislature expected to pass final state budget
June 28	Campus Deadline	Final budgets entered into Hyperion
July 23-24	CSU Board of Trustees	Final CSU budget approval

Strategic Initiatives FY19-20 Timeline (high-level)

February SRPC to issue instructions for Strategic Initiatives Proposals

May All divisions submit their Strategic Initiatives proposals to

their respective Cabinet member

August All divisions submit their respective proposals to the SRPC

September SRPC reviews proposals and issues funding

recommendations to the Presidents for consideration

October President announces final funding allocations for proposals

November funding made available to **awardees**
