Provide short-term counseling, phone services

Due to funding, cannot hire additional counselors to alleviate scheduling wait times

Bumps, bruises, lacerations

Outsource uncovered services- students use insurance

Services

Events, presentations, SMART Goals appointments, peer education program, service learning students, massage chairs

- Salary savings and extra money each year go to reserves
- Savings now can help cover deficits in the future
- When enrollment goes up, fee generates more money
- Discrepancy between projected vs. actual dollar amount available for a fiscal year
- Generally, enrollment increases by 2% but the projection is lower
- Some unknowns
- Why are headcounts not aligning with reserve numbers?
- Need to increase the fee in the future or remodel
- Increases to salaries and increases to student enrollment = we hope they equal out
- Cost of staff, business, and student wages increase
- Fee increase: requires a referendum. Students must vote.
- Immunizations = Executive Order from Chancellor's Office
- Increased needs for staffing
