- 1. What did your team commit to completing during this month? (What did you promise?)

- 2. What did you do and how will it help?
 - a. Dr. Cindy Wyels joined the Student Success Partnership Steering Committee. As the Director of Student Success for the ACCESSO grant, she is a very important addition to the committee.
