SUBJECT: CSU Student Activities Heat Illness Prevention Reference Guide

The purpose of the *CSU Student Activities Heat Illness Prevention Resource Guide* is to develop a process for assessing environmental risk factors for heat illness during student activities in order to mitigate risks related to heat illness. These guidelines apply to University, Club and Auxiliary sponsored, approved or authorized activities. These activities may take place on or off campus.

The guide lays out how each campus may identify courses and activities with potential heat exposure and steps to mitigate exposure. The guide includes:

- heat illness risk factors,
- heat illness (signs and, symptoms),
- weather monitoring,
- exposure reduction techniques,
- emergency procedures,
- training,
- and record keeping.

The adoption of this guide will require support from Academic Affairs, Student Affairs and Administration and Finance. The Deployment of the resource guide is representative of the CSU's mission by mitigating a substantive risk factor to our students.
