Noel Buena joined the CSU family 28 years ago, starting in the IT department at CSUN. In 1999, he began his work at CI, and currently is working as the *Property Coordinator*. In this role, he collaborates with Procurement Property Management to implement property procedures.

Noel plays a part in the first steps towards the survey process, which includes storage and disposal of furniture and auditing. There are many background duties, too, such as tracking and tagging assets and organizing

surplus. Other projects require coordination with the OPC work center.

Noel is also a mentor to students in his role as club advisor for the CI Kilusan Pilipino Student Organization, which began in 2010. This multicultural club promotes the Filipino culture, and participates in a number of activities. One of these is the Annual Filipino Culture Night, which includes dance performances and a favorite dish called lumpia. This group also takes part in Relay for Life.

Human Resources (HRP)

- The Human Resources annual CalPERS Retirement
 workshop was held in March, with 66 employees in
 attendance. This free educational class provides information and assistance to employees who are planning and preparing for retirement.
- The Staff Service Awards and Faculty Commemoration was held on April 9th. This marks the first year that faculty was recognized in this venue. The red carpet event honored 130 employees, with 67 from the Division of Finance & Administration, including two from HRP; Diana Enos for 10 years of service and Ria Fidler for 5 years.
- HRP has initiated a LEAN project that will streamline the employee requisition process. The vision is to

- create an innovative solution to improve efficiency while enhancing customer service.
- The Student Assistant Compensation Plan was updated and posted on the Human Resources web site. This plan is a guide about administering compensation for student workers who are classified as Student Assistants or Work Study Student Assistants.
- The New Hire Orientation takes place twice annually and is designed to provide an overview of CI, including information about health and life insurance benefits, flexible spending accounts, retirement savings plans, gym memberships, CI policies, and more.

Public Safety


- The Public Safety Unit consists of University Police,
